: What should I do if I am already in a violent relationship?




### DANGER

Early Warning Signs that Your Date May Eventually Become Abusive:

- Extreme jealousy
- Controlling behavior
- Quick involvement
- Unpredictable mood swings
- Alcohol and drug use
- Explosive anger
- Isolates you from family and friends
- Uses force during an argument
- Shows hypersensitivity
- Believes in rigid sex roles
- Blames others for his/her problems or feelings
- Cruel to animals or children
- Verbally abusive
- Abused former partners
- Threatens violence

Bouncing back; elasticity; empowered to recover; return to normal state; overcome; to triumph!


My friend had been in an abusive relationship for a year.

### History of Teen Dating Violence Prevention Month



For years, young people across the nation have organized to put a stop to dating violence. With their adult allies, they achieved a major victory in 2005 when the importance of addressing teen dating violence was highlighted in the reauthorization of the Violence Against Women Act.

The following year, Congress followed the lead of dozens of national, state and local organizations in sounding the call to end teen dating violence. Both Chambers declared the first full week in February "National Teen Dating Violence Prevention and Awareness Week."

Then in 2010, Congress began dedicating the entire month of February

to teen dating violence awareness and prevention. Now in its second year, Teen DV Month is celebrated by leaders in government, student bodies, schools, youth service providers, community-based organizations, parents and more.





### leen dating violence Statistics

Teens report dating abuse via cell phones as a serious problem.

1 in 3 teens experiences some kind of abuse in their romantic relationships.

Teens are susceptible to the same types of abuse as adults, some methods are unique to the teen culture, particularly "technological abuse," — receiving threats via text messages or social networking sites like Facebook.

1 in 5 high school girls is physically or sexually hurt by a dating partner.

Cell phone calls and texting means constant control. 1 in 3 teens say they are text messaged 10,20, 30 times an hour by a partner keeping tabs on them.

### Dating Violence

Dating abuse or dating violence is defined as the perpetration or threat of an act of violence by at least one member of an unmarried couple on the other member within the context of dating or courtship. It is also when one partner tries to

maintain power and control over the other through abuse/violence. This abuse/violence encompasses all forms: sexual assault sexual harassment, threats, physical violence, verbal, mental, or emotional abuse, social sabotage, and stalking. Dating violence crosses all racial, age, economic and social lines.



### What is Dating Violence?


Dating violence is a pattern of abusive behaviors used to exert **power and control** over a dating partner.

### A Pattern of Behavior

Calling dating violence a pattern doesn't mean the first instance of abuse is not dating violence. It just recognizes that dating violence usually involves a series of abusive behaviors over a course of time. Every relationships is different, but the one thing that is common to most abusive dating relationships is that the violence escalates over time and becomes more and more dangerous for the victim.

### Power and Control

The definition also points out that at the core of dating violence are issues of **power and control**. Violent words and actions are tools an abusive partner uses to gain and maintain power and control over his or her partner.


